Simplified Language

 Use layman's terms and avoid technical jargon to enhance understanding.

Educational Sessions

 Conduct workshops or training sessions to explain policy nuances and implications effectively.

INFORMING POLICY RECEPTORS



Accessible Communication Channels

 Utilise various platforms such as dedicated websites, newsletters, and social media to provide regular updates and information about ongoing policy developments.

Engagement Workshops

 Organise interactive sessions or workshops where policy details are presented in accessible formats, allowing stakeholders to ask questions and gain a deeper understanding.

Collaborative Platforms

 Create online forums or community groups to encourage ongoing discussions and information sharing regarding policy initiatives.

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Public Consultations

 Conducting open sessions where stakeholders can voice opinions, offer suggestions, and provide insights into policy directions.

Stakeholder Forums

 Establishing regular meetings or forums bringing together diverse stakeholders to deliberate on policy aspects and share perspectives.

Online Surveys

 Deploying user-friendly surveys or questionnaires to gather structured feedback from stakeholders on specific policy aspects.

Focus Groups

 Conducting focused group discussions to delve deeper into stakeholders' opinions, allowing for more qualitative feedback.

Feedback Forms

 Providing easily accessible forms or platforms for stakeholders to submit their feedback, suggestions, and concerns.

Data Analysis

 Using tools and methodologies to analyse quantitative feedback obtained through surveys or quantitative assessments.

Thematic Analysis

 Employing qualitative analysis techniques to extract themes and insights from qualitative feedback, such as focus group discussions or open-ended survey responses.

Integration into Policy

 Integrating valuable feedback into policy revisions, updates, or adjustments to address identified concerns and improve policy effectiveness.

 Establishing consistent communication channels to keep stakeholders informed about policy progress, upcoming developments, and opportunities for engagement.


Regular Consultations
