#### **Project Summary**

- A Horizon 2020 Innovation Action to build a cloud platform that will offer artificial intelligence based services for STI policy
- A 4 million euros budget from January 2021 to December 2023
- A multidisciplinary team of 13 partners (6 countries) from academia, the private sector and public administrations responsible of STI policy



#### The IntelComp platform

- It will be able to process and analyze large volumes of **textual data** from open data (e.g. OpenAIRE datasets), **using artificial intelligence techniques**
- It will be located on a High Performance Computing environment, part of the European Open Science Cloud initiative
- Conceptually it relates with two existing platforms for STI policy: Corpus Viewer and Data4Impact



#### The IntelComp platform

- It will be tested on specific STI policies: artificial intelligence, climate change and health
- It will be co-created with public administrations and all relevant stakeholders (academia, industry and citizens) to address specific policy questions
- It is designed to assist the whole spectrum of STI policy: agenda setting, policy formulation, implementation, monitoring & evaluation
