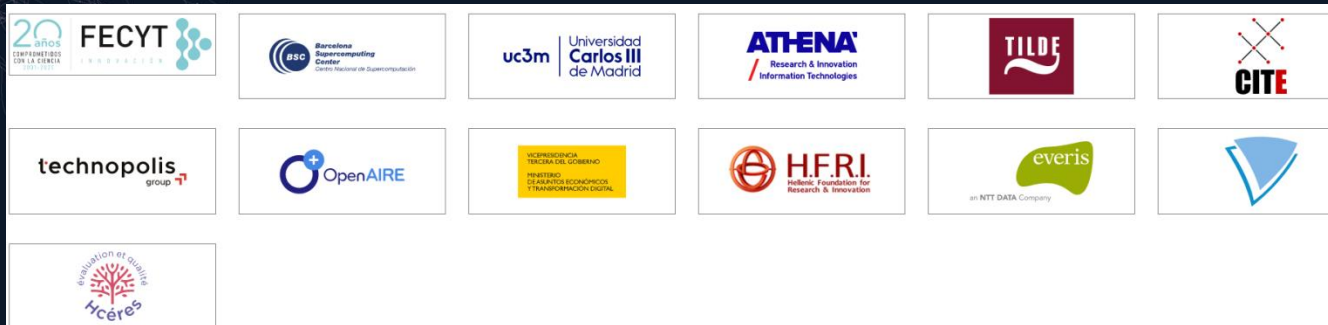

Project Summary

- A **Horizon 2020 Innovation Action** to build a **cloud platform** that will offer artificial intelligence based services for STI policy
- A **4 million euros budget** from January 2021 to December 2023
- A **multidisciplinary team of 13 partners** (6 countries) from academia, the private sector and public administrations responsible of STI policy

The IntelComp platform

- It will be able to process and analyze large volumes of **textual data** from open data (e.g. OpenAIRE datasets), **using artificial intelligence techniques**
- It will be located on a **High Performance Computing** environment, part of the **European Open Science Cloud initiative**
- Conceptually it relates with two existing platforms for STI policy: Corpus Viewer and Data4Impact

The IntelComp platform

- It will be tested on specific STI policies: artificial intelligence, **climate change** and health
- It will be **co-created with public administrations and all relevant stakeholders** (academia, industry and citizens) to address specific policy questions
- It is designed to assist the **whole spectrum of STI policy**: agenda setting, policy formulation, implementation, monitoring & evaluation
